The Forgiveness of Sins

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." (John 20:21-23)

The liturgies of confession and absolution and the excommunication of stubbornly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation are based on this passage of Scripture and the words of Jesus in Matthew 18. Absolution and excommunication are when Christ's Word is applied directly to sinners. The word of absolution, "I forgive you all your sins," is spoken to every penitent sinner who is brought to repentance and confesses his sins. This word gives Christ's forgiveness which He earned for every sinner on the cross. The word of excommunication is spoken to every openly impenitent sinner within the congregation who refuses to repent of his sin and believe the gospel. This word binds the impenitent sinner's sins to him, not because his sins are too great to be forgiven, but because he has rejected the Gospel of forgiveness by refusing repentance.

Absolution is not limited in that it can only be spoken only in a certain, specific setting or by a specific person. Confession and Absolution in the Divine Service is a helpful liturgical innovation from the past few centuries that grew out of the practice of having a Service of Confession and Exhortation to Communion offered to those who had announced their desire to commune or who were preparing to receive the Sacrament. As is stated in "Gathered Guests," a helpful textbook on Lutheran worship, "The confession provides worshipers with a time and a text to lead them into the dark depths of their souls and to recognize their need for Jesus, the light of the world."

Forgiveness can and should be offered in other situations, too. A pastor can absolve someone from behind his desk in his study or someone who loses his temper at a congregational meeting. A principal or teacher can absolve a student for breaking a school rule. Brothers and sisters in Christ are to confess their sins to one another, just as God in Christ has forgiven them. They are also to let go of the sins others have committed against them, and commend everyone who is impenitent to the mercy of God.

As Lutherans, we believe that Jesus' words in John 20 give the "Office of the Keys," the authority to forgive and retain sins, to the whole church. This Office can and should be used by all Christians. Corporately, the church then entrusts the Office of the Keys to pastors so that they will be publicly exercised on behalf of the congregation. This is an extension of the Preaching Office, to ensure that forgiveness is offered to penitent sinners.

C. F. W. Walther, the founder of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, speaks to the assurance we have in absolution: "At absolution, we say nothing but what has happened. That is the precious truth that forgiveness of sins has been acquired. If we would truly believe in absolution, with what joy would we attend church whenever it is pronounced." May that joy be for us all.

President's Post:

In his Small Catechism, Martin Luther instructs us as to the Eighth Commandment:



You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

You often hear people say, “I am my own worst critic.” While that is sometimes an accurate statement, it is by no means always the case. While constructive criticism, be it self-criticism, or criticism in an earnest effort to assist a brother or sister in Christ, can truly be a positive in our lives, helping us to better ourselves and address issues we may not even perceive; criticism spoken with intent or effect of betrayal, slander, or damage to reputation, is not only unkind and unhelpful, it is sin. We all fall short in one way or another, and in this area, many of us fall short indeed.

This particular sin, while forgiven through the grace and sacrifice of our precious Lord, is nonetheless harmful to ourselves, to our brothers and sisters, to our relationships, and to the various groups and organizations of which we are a part. Unfortunately, this sin is not absent from our Church. I do not believe it to be any more endemic or injurious to our Church than any other, but nonetheless, it is hurtful to individuals, to our Church, and to our mission to serve our Lord.

I ask each of you to remember the words of Christ in His Sermon on the Mount, “Judge not, that you be not judged.”

If you have sincere concerns about a brother or sister, have courage, go to them directly and address it; follow the instruction of Matthew 18:15-17 for conflict resolution. I will do my best to do so, but in the meantime, I’ll be over here pulling the plank out of my own eye.

The Lord bless thee, and keep thee:
The Lord make his face shine upon thee, and be gracious unto thee:
The Lord lift up his countenance upon thee, and give thee peace.

Elder's Page



When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. – Acts 2:1-2

“Do you believe in miracles?! Yes!!” – the words of Al Michaels as he called the end of the hockey game between the USA and the Soviet Union in the 1980 Olympics. A group of college kids had beaten the dominant team of the previous two decades in one of sports’ most unlikely upsets in history. For many Americans, having just exited the 1970s – Vietnam, Watergate, OPEC, the hostage crisis in Iran – it was more than just another gold medal. It was a morale boost that, in its own small way, helped begin to restore Americans’ confidence.

Jesus’ disciples on the eve of Pentecost had also been on an emotional roller coaster the previous two months. They had seen Him ride into Jerusalem to the cheers of the crowd, then seen Him crucified, then He rose from the dead, and finally ascended into heaven, leaving them alone for the moment. We can understand if they were a bit wrung out after all of this. Some were even asking Jesus, right up to His ascension, if He was going to restore the kingdom to Israel. Although they had witnessed the fulfillment of His redemptive work, they still didn’t quite get it. They needed a real miracle.

In our culture, the word “miracle” is used for a lot of relatively mundane things (such as sporting events – see above). But Jesus had shown His disciples the real thing on many occasions, culminating with his resurrection and ascension. Finally, on Pentecost, the final piece of the puzzle fell into place with one last great miracle – their baptism with the Holy Spirit. At last they understood clearly and began to spread the gospel, starting in Jerusalem and eventually throughout the whole world. It was the Holy Spirit that gave these otherwise ordinary men the faith, wisdom, understanding, and confidence to speak boldly in Jesus’ name.

This is the time of year that we most appreciate the Holy Spirit and the work He has done all these centuries. The Church would not be sustainable without Him and each believer’s faith depends on Him. Luther writes in the Small Catechism, “I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.” Even Jesus’ disciples, who had seen it all with their own eyes, needed the Holy Spirit to complete the process.

We’re now in the season where we remember the end of Jesus’ ministry, His ascension into heaven, and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the early church. Let’s all take some extra time to appreciate what a great miracle that was, and to pray that the Holy Spirit would continue to strengthen each of us, our church here at Bethlehem, and the Christian Church throughout the world.



Our committee is working on the 60th anniversary celebration event scheduled for September 15th, 2019.




