Week 3 – March 15<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 p.m. Gethsemane • Matthew 26:47-56 Jesus is betrayed and arrested in this garden under cover of darkness.

Week 4 – March 22<sup>nd</sup>, 6:30 p.m. The Courtyard • Matthew 26:57-69 While Jesus is put on trial before the high priest, Peter denies Jesus in this place.

Week 5 – March 29<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 p.m. Pilate's Judgment Hall • Matthew 27:11-23 Pilate is positioned here to set Jesus free, but turns Him over to be crucified instead.

Palm Sunday – April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 8:00 & 10:30 a.m. Bethphage • Matthew 21:1-11 This place is where the ride into Jerusalem on a donkey begins for Jesus.

Maundy Thursday – April 6<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 p.m. The Upper Room • Matthew 26:17-29 Climb the stairs to join the disciples in receiving the body and blood of Christ in bread and wine.

> **Good Friday – April 7<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 p.m.** Golgotha • Matthew 27:45-56 *The Place of the Skull is where Jesus breathes His last.*

Hunger and Thirst

As most of you know, I spent most of my life in the Third World before I came to the United States. So, it was quite a surprise for me when I arrived here to see the abundance of food. It did not matter whether or not it was at a Church meeting, a private home, or some fund-raising function. There was always not only lots of food but a variety of food. Even with the recent supply chain problems, it does not appear to have radically affected the supply of food around here.

In some of the places that I have lived, supply and demand did not apply as it does in the United States, and it was quota system that was in place. So if you did not get to the store in time, you were greeted with empty shelves. Hunger and thirst were a reality for me.

But as I have grown in the Faith here in the United States, I have realized that hunger and thirst have a deeper meaning, where I Hunger and Thirst for God. And love for God comes only from Him, as a gift to those who belong to Christ (1 John 4:19) This means that the only ones who can truly hunger and thirst are believers, while the rest of the people yearn for other material things like wealth, security, control, or prominence, which they mistakenly think will satisfy their soul.

One of the great examples in the Bible can be found in (Luke 10:38)), when Jesus came to a village where a women named Martha opened her home to Him. She had a sister called Mary, who promptly sat at the Lord's feet listening to what He said, but Martha was distracted by serving all the food preparations.

In Matthew 5:6, Jesus says, Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. In this verse, Jesus is referring to a spiritual hunger and thirst. Blessed is another word for happy and most of us are looking for happiness but eating your favorite meal might momentarily satisfy you, but things in this world do not have lasting fulfillment.

So, in conclusion, it might be time to distinguish which hunger and thirst are likely to provide lasting happiness for us.

# **President's Post**

Bethlehem Lutheran family, this month's newsletter will focus on the season of Lent. There are some excellent resources available on the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod website (lcms.org). I found some links to Lutheran Hour Ministries (lhm.org) with a downloadable book called "MAN OF SORROWS, PEOPLE OF JOY". This has daily devotions that can be used by yourself, with your family, or can be shared with others. I've included one of the devotions as our Catechism for this month. I've also included the church financials to keep you informed of our shared responsibilities to help spread the Word here in the Carson City/Carson Valley area.

#### Catechism – IN THE MIDDLE WITH US

And over His head they put the charge against Him, which read, "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews." Then two robbers were crucified with Him, one on the right and one on the left. (Matthew 27:37-38)

It's a good place for Jesus, don't you think? Crucified between two thieves. Given the kind of people He welcomed during his life, I'm sure He felt right at home!

And that's good for you and for me – because we need Jesus just as much as those two dying men did. Oh, we may not be robbers; but we have our own sins, just as deadly, even if they're a lot less conspicuous. Hatred; gossip; pride; back-biting; cheating just a little, here and there, resentment; self-centeredness – all the ordinary sins that add up to have such a life-destroying effect. We may not be nailed to a cross like those robbers, but without Jesus, we'd be just as hopeless – just as surely heading for death.

But we do have Jesus – right here next to us, within call if not within physical reach. We can ask for the help we need, the same way one of those men did when he said, "Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom" (Luke 23:42b). Jesus will sure give it. After all, it's the reason He came into our world – to seek out the lost and to bring us home to God through His own suffering, death, and resurrection.

Lord, bring me too into Your kingdom. Amen.

Do you think the thief who asked for mercy understood what he was asking for?

If so, how do you think he knew it?

How did you come to know Jesus and what He has done for you?

We're in the beginning of Lent, and we are considering the sacrifices the Jesus has made on our behalf. We're having our mid-week services and soup suppers during Lent. # BETHLEHEM CHURCH FINANCIALS: (Narrative/Comments)

#### MONTH:

January Offerings of \$24,481 were \$1,162 more than the budget. The <u>average</u> monthly need is \$22,767 (\$273,200/12 mos.) January Offerings were also \$3,186 more than last January. Giving Units at 64 increased by 8 over December and were the same as January of last year.

Payroll & Benefits were \$823 under budget due to a billing change by Concordia Plan Services for retirement benefits. They changed from advance month billing to current month billing which resulted in no bill in January.

Other Operating Expense was \$694 under the budget. The underrun is spread amount multiple expense line items, and most are likely related to timing issues.

**MITE BOX SUNDAY**. On the first Sunday of each month, mite offerings are collected. The mites are sent to the California, Nevada, Hawaii LWML District to help fund the mission projects. Bethlehem Lutheran Church has sent The mites collected in February mites were used to help fund the *Walking with Women Leaders sponsored by LINC and LCMS Bay area churches in Hayward, California.* The mites collected in March\_will help with funding *International Seminary Students, Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Missouri.* There is a significant shortage of well-formed Lutheran pastors in some parts of the world because options are few for advanced theological study for these pastors and few overseas Lutheran church bodies have the resources to send their most capable students to the US for this advanced study. Concordia Seminary, St. Louis currently has 50 international students from 25 different countries. After graduation the students will serve as seminary professors, theological instructors and church leaders in their respective countries. The estimated number of lives that these students/pastors/professors will impact in their home countries could be in the many thousands. A wide variety of cultures and ethnicities in many nations will be impacted, including a significant number of unchurched people. The grant funds will help provide vital support for Concordia Seminary's international students.

This may mean serving following a funeral, serving a meal for a small group meeting, or just cookies for a group meeting. 
