From the Desk of Rev. Dr. Jedidiah Maschke

At the beginning of this past school year, Ali, my oldest daughter, was asked in one of her high school classes what book she would like to have that has not yet been written. She answered, “My Dad’s doctorate, because he’s been working on that basically my entire life.”

She’s not wrong. It has been thirteen years since I officially began the Doctor of Ministry program through Concordia Seminary in St. Louis. From 2010 until 2016, I took a number of courses honing my skills in different areas. Some were tied with the Pastoral Leadership Institute (PLI) program I took part in from 2010—2013. Then from 2013—2014, I led several members of my former church as we completed a two-year program learning about discipleship and mission through another organization called 3DM.

In 2014 I began taking in-person classes at the seminary for my doctorate, with a Missional Leadership concentration. Here’s the official description from Concordia Seminary:

The Missional Leadership concentration is designed to prepare pastors for leadership of congregations in their place in the Mission of God (Missio Dei). It guides students in critical reflection on the theology, theory, and practice of leading the people of God to participate in the Mission of God in contemporary cultures. The Missional Leadership concentration seeks to transform pastors (and their congregations) in their commitment and ability to witness in word and deed to God’s salvation in Jesus Christ and to share the reconciling gospel with those alienated from God by unbelief.

Many of my classes I took were leadership-based, such as “Multiplying Missional Leaders,” “Shepherding the Growing Parish,” and “Leadership and the *Missio Dei*.” I also took some exegetical classes that focused on preaching, including an intense look at Isaiah 40-55 with Dr. Reed Lessing, and “Exegetical Theology Today” with Dr. Timothy Saleska. Then in early 2016, I took “Project Research and Writing,” preparing me for my final project for getting my doctorate. However, after accepting the call to come here to Carson City later that spring, my doctoral work went on hold for a few years.

In 2019, I rededicated myself to finishing my Major Applied Project (MAP), formulating my proposal and getting that approved. I did that by going back to PLI and working with them to write a companion guide for their Discipleship to Missional Community (D2MC) program, which is based on the training offered by 3DM. Basically, with my background learning about discipleship and leadership in PLI’s previous programs and my experience as a frontier leader for 3DM, my project was to examine the D2MC program from confessional Lutheran perspective and to write a guide helping people in that program to understand how that discipleship program connects with our theology.

Just as I was getting ready to field test the companion guide in early 2020, the COVID pandemic hit, and my plans for field-testing the companion guide went out the window with the lockdown. However, this actually turned into a blessing! I was still able to share the draft of my companion guide over the internet, but instead of traveling across the country to do interviews and lead focus groups, I was able to do the field testing and collect research over Zoom from the comfort of my office here in Carson City. I had about a dozen people critique what I wrote, and then I summarized my findings along with examining the theology and the books that served as the basis for D2MC.

Over the last few years, I have devoted much of my free time to finish writing my MAP, often on Saturdays here at church. After examining the D2MC program, I believe it is theologically solid and very practical and beneficial. I was also grateful that people found my companion guide to be helpful and even inspiring, along with offering some constructive criticism with ways I could improve what I have written.

What's next? As far as school is concerned, I'm not looking to add any more degrees. I do enjoy doing some research, but I enjoy parish ministry and missional leadership right here where I am at Bethlehem. I also know that with my children hitting the teen years, I'm entering a busy season of life. I'll also be sharing what I've learned in our Sunday morning Bible study and sermons and upcoming newsletter articles as they are applicable. And if you're interested in reading some of my 222 page paper with more than 400 footnotes, I'll be happy to share that as soon as it's published.

A number of people have asked me what I'm to be called now. My full, official title is Rev. Dr. Maschke, but I'm still happy to answer to Pastor Maschke or Coach Maschke.

I'd like to thank all the members of Bethlehem for your support as I've worked to finish this project. I couldn't have done this without your patience and encouragement, and I look forward to sharing the benefits with you all in the coming years!

BETHLEHEM CHURCH FINANCIALS: (Narrative/Comments)

MONTH: • April Offerings of \$28,614 were \$4,095 more than the budget. The average monthly need is \$22,767 (\$273,200/12 mos.) April Offerings were also \$2,856 more than last April. Giving Units at 67 increased by 1 compared to March and were also 1 less than last April.

- School Support was less than budget due to a process delay that moved the expense timing to May.
- **Payroll & Benefits** were \$67 slightly less than budget.
- **Other Operating Expense** was \$1,474 under the budget due to various underruns in multiple categories.

YTD: • Offerings through April are \$1,499 under budget. However, they are \$17,263 greater than last year.

• **Payroll & Benefits** show as being \$590 over budget. This is mainly due to an unbudgeted 3rd paycheck for the church secretary i.e., there are 27 pay periods in this fiscal year as opposed to the normal 26. This was noted in June's report. It also includes the church's unbudgeted portion of a disability payment made in October. These overruns were somewhat offset by the January Concordia Plan Services billing change from advanced billing to current billing that caused a permanent skipped payment for January.

• **Other Operating Expense** is currently \$6,861 under budget. This is due to an unbudgeted repair for the church's front door entry/exit hardware in July of nearly \$5,000 more than offset by underruns in multiple expense line items, some of which may be timing issues.

NORMALIZATION: • Normalizing Cumulative Actual Income and Expense for certain prospective and/or retrospective amounts that tend to distort current Y-T-D Financial Income produces the following results: \$246,428 Offerings and Income, \$233,581 Expense resulting in \$12,847 Net Financial Income. The primary driver of this difference being liability insurance that is paid in June and the delayed health insurance billing discussed above.

Pentecost is one of the great festivals of the Church. In modern popular culture it isn't nearly as well known as Christmas or Easter, but for Christians, it's profoundly significant. It marks the coming of the Holy Spirit on the disciples and their transformation from frightened and confused people to men who would face martyrdom for what they believed.

Pentecost means '50' - Pentecost is from The Greek word "Pentekostos", which means 'fifty'. It's the 50th day after the Sabbath of Passover week and in Judaism is called the Feast of Weeks (Leviticus 23:16)

It's traditionally celebrated as Whitsun. The word Pentecost has become more common in the UK, but traditionally the church celebrated it as Whitsun—'White Sunday'. It's believed that this is because it was a day for baptisms and those being baptized would wear white. Another explanation is that it derives from the Anglo-Saxon word 'wit', which we still use for verbal cleverness but which meant 'understanding' - Pentecost was when God poured out the wisdom of the Spirit.

Pentecost is the fulfilment of two promises. One promise is in the Old Testament—Joel 2:28, which says "I will pour out my Spirit on all people", and one in the New, where Jesus says he will send another Counsellor, the Spirit of Truth (John 16:5-15).

There was wind... Luke tells of three distinct experiences. A violent wind filled the house: breath or wind is a symbol of the Spirit of God. Ezekiel 37 tells the story of the prophet's vision of a valley of dry bones which come together: when the 'breath' of God enters them, they come to life and stand on their feet. The Pentecost wind represents the power of God to bring life to the 'dry bones' of faith.

...and tongues of fire... Tongues of fire separate and come to rest on each of them. Jesus told his disciples, "You are the light of the world" Matthew 5:14. In John 8:12 he says, "I am the light of the world." The picture in Acts seems to be of a single flame that separates and symbolically rests on each of them; the disciples will do what Jesus did.

...and other languages. The nature of the original experience has been queried, but in Luke's telling of it the point is that it breaks down barriers between people. The story links back to one of the earliest of the Old Testament stories, in Genesis 11, when the people begin to build the huge Tower of Babel. God confuses their language so they can no longer understand each other. At Pentecost, this Babel confusion is reversed.

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church. It marks the beginning of Christianity as a purposeful movement and a new community. When Peter preached immediately afterwards, around 3,000 people believed and were baptized.

May the Lord bless you and protect you. May his love endure in your life.
