Understanding Israel in God's Eyes

Over the past few weeks with the latest war between Israel and Hamas, there has been a flurry of interest in what the Bible says regarding the nation of Israel. For those who believe in dispensationalism, the belief that there are seven distinct epochs or dispensations in history, the creation of a Jewish nation-state in the middle east seems like a fulfillment of biblical prophecy and a harbinger of the rapture and Christ's thousand-year reign on earth. It has even been said that the reestablishment of Israel as a Jewish state in 1948 is a "super sign" that we have entered the last days. However, there are some theological issues we Lutherans have with equating the modern-day nation of Israel with the Israel we read about in the Bible.

In his letter to the Galatians, Paul distinguishes between the role of the law in the Old Testament age versus the New Testament age. He writes, "the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ." (Gal. 3:24-27) The law of Moses protected the Old Testament believers' faith in Yahweh, the faith of the patriarchs and prophets. Modern Bible commentaries call this Yahwism.

During the intertestamental age, a new religion grew out of Yahwism. This was the religion of the Pharisees, which was based on the works of the law. This religion added the teachings of the Talmud and the tradition of the elders to the beliefs of their Old Testament forefathers. Jesus speaks out against this perversion of the true faith which "shut the kingdom of heaven in people's faces." (Matt. 23:13) The danger of this new belief system, according to Jesus, was that the Pharisees "tie up heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on people's shoulders." (Matt. 23:4)

Some of the Jewish people, including Jesus' disciples and Paul, listened to Jesus and believed in His message. Others stubbornly adhered to their own traditions and commandments. In the end, the Pharisees only succeeded in "making void the word of God," (Mark 7:13) and so God punished Israel for their unbelief by enacting the curses of Deuteronomy 28, with their enemies besieging them (v. 52) and even driving them to cannibalism (v. 53) before they were scattered "among all people, from one end of the earth to the other." (v. 64) Their unbelief caused them to be driven out from the land.

We Lutherans have a theological problem with believing that the Jewish people have a divine, unending right to live in Israel. This has to do with what Paul says in Romans about those who are descended from Israel and which people in the present time "belong to Israel." (Rom. 9:6) Paul writes that "not all are children of Abraham because they are his offspring." (9:7) The only way to belong to Israel in the present age, the only way to be saved, is "if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead." (10:9)

Christianity is the fulfillment of Yahwism. The patriarchs and prophets looked forward in faith to the coming Messiah, but we who live in the New Testament age look back to the Messiah who has come and fulfilled the messianic promises in Jesus Christ. Through faith, by baptism, those who believe in Christ now belong to Israel.

Paul writes in Romans that in the new Israel, lineage doesn't matter. Non-believing Jews have been "broken off" from Israel (Rom. 11:17a), while Gentiles, "although a wild olive shoot, were grafted in among the others and now share in the nourishing root of the olive tree." (11:17b) Unfortunately, the modern nation of Israel continues in large part to reject Christ. Only 1.9% of the country confesses Christ as Lord. Those who actively practice Orthodox Judaism today still follow the teachings of Talmud and the tradition of the elders, like the Pharisees of Jesus' day. The descendants of Abraham no longer "belong to Israel" in God's eyes. They are still under God's curse.

But hope is not lost! "Has God rejected his people?" Paul asks. "By no means!" (Rom. 11:1) As for his fellow Jews, "they are beloved for the sake of their forefathers. For the gifts and calling of God are irrevocable." (Rom. 11:28b-29) So we hope and pray and share the gospel when we have opportunity that Jews may one day answer that call and accept God's gifts and be grafted once again into the true Israel. That is God's will for all people.

BETHLEHEM CHURCH FINANCIALS: (Narrative/Comments)

- September Offerings of \$19,788 were \$3,612 less than budgeted. Offerings were \$460 more than last September. Giving Units were 64, an increase of 1 from August and 2 more than last September.
- Parsonage rent has increased from \$1,800 to \$2,000 per month. NY Life Muni Bond Fund market value fell (\$2,692) in the third quarter offsetting other Misc. Income and resulting in a loss of (\$2,248) for the month.

Bethlehem Women in Mission (BWM)

Mite Box Sunday: On the first Sunday of each month, mite offerings are collected. As of October Bethlehem members have contributed \$608.31 to the District projects. The mites are sent to the California, Nevada, Hawaii LWML District to help fund the mission projects. Bethlehem Lutheran Church sent the mites collected in October to help fund Connecting Mercy & Church Planting in Latin America sponsored by LCMS Office of International Mission in Latin America and the Caribbean Region. The mites collected in November will help fund Matongo Seminary Chapel – sponsored by LCMS Office of International Mission, Africa Region.







Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) has a long-standing relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK) and are together in Altar and Pulpit Fellowship. Matongo Lutheran Seminary, located in Kenya, is a conservative confessional Lutheran college and provides a variety of credentials to students from a Certificate in Deaconess Studies to a Bachelor's Degree in Theology for pastoral candidates. Students come from across the greater Eastern Africa area. Matongo Lutheran Seminary is the only institution recognized by the ELCK for training of pastors, deaconesses and evangelists for its congregations. The center for spiritual life for a seminary is its chapel; essential for the campus community for daily worship, encouragements and strengthening for spiritual formation. Currently the seminary is using a multi-purpose room for daily worship services in Kishwahili and English. The grant is seeking funds to help build a proper chapel at the seminary.

That is why Christ reminds us so often that things will always get better. Romans chapter 28 "and we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him." He has given us that promise of eternal life and eternal happiness.
