Midweek 1 (Wednesday, Dec. 1 at 6:30 p.m.): Come, O Wisdom In the first week of our Advent series, we delve into the "O Wisdom" antiphon, rejoicing in the guidance that Christ provides for us. His wisdom is the cornerstone of our faith, and we look forward to exploring this aspect of His divine nature.

Midweek 2 (Wednesday, Dec. 8 at 6:30 p.m.): Come, O Lord During the second week of our series, we contemplate the "O Lord" antiphon. We will rejoice that Jesus is the great "I AM" who is all-holy and all-powerful, reinforcing our faith in Him.

Midweek 3 (Wednesday, Dec. 15 at 6:30 p.m.): Come, O Root of Jesse In week three, we explore the "O Root of Jesse" antiphon and rejoice in the profound connection it represents. Through Jesus, we become part of God's family tree, tracing our spiritual lineage to Him.

Midweek 4 (Wednesday, Dec. 22 at 6:30 p.m.): Come, O Key of David In the fourth week, we focus on the "O Key of David" antiphon. We rejoice that Jesus holds the key that unlocks the door to heaven for us, bringing us closer to God's eternal promise.

### MONTH:

- October Offerings of \$27,527 were \$4,127 more than budgeted. Offerings were \$2,684 more than last October. Giving Units were 64, unchanged from September but 3 less than last October.
- Increased offerings lead to income of \$5,958 for the month. Income exceeded budget by \$3,751.

#### Y-T-D:

 YTD Net Income of \$3,993 is now only (\$3,129) below budget. The increased offerings in October leave us much closer to being on budget.

### **Bethlehem Women in Mission (BWM)**

Mite Box Sunday: On the first Sunday of each month, mite offerings are collected. As of November Bethlehem members have contributed \$628.31 to the District projects. The mites are sent to the California, Nevada, Hawaii LWML District to help fund the mission projects. Bethlehem Lutheran Church sent the mites collected in November to help fund *Matongo Seminary Chapel – sponsored by LCMS Office of International Mission, Africa Region.* The mites collected in December will help fund *Gospel Outreach in Thailand* Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) sees a tremendous opportunity to share God's love reaching out with the Gospel to the people of Thailand. LHM-Thailand's work is rapidly expanding to all area of the country. Most of the population is non-Christian. LHM in Thailand has a variety of outreaches: radio programming, digital and social media, Bible correspondence courses, evangelism training seminars and special events. All these programs are done in the native language of Thailand as well as culturally appropriate ways for the various regions. The grant funds would be used for all the above outreach programs.

This thought message came in the monthly newsletter from CNH LWML District office and I wanted to share it with you.

### Change
