#### Looking Back, Looking Ahead

Last January, I wrote in my newsletter article about how I had begun listening to the Bible each morning as I exercised by walking on a treadmill in our garage. I am pleased to report that over the course of the year, I made it through the whole Bible, finishing up in late October. So, in November, I started over, this time with a reading plan that goes through the Bible in chronological order.

It has been interesting to read through the Bible again from this perspective, even if some things are not in the order that I am used to. One example is that since Job lived around the same time as Abraham, this plan reads through his book immediately after finishing Genesis. There are also random bits of the genealogy from 1 Chronicles interspersed among the genealogy in Genesis. The chapters detailing the ceremonial law and sacrifices in Leviticus and Numbers are still a challenge, though, especially when there is a lot of repetition.

However, I have noticed that it has made a big difference for me. I really do feel more comfortable and familiar with the Bible as a whole and I am finding that I am making connections between different texts that I had never noticed before. It's well worth it, and to be honest, listening to the Bible is really not that hard. Maybe reading through the Bible would be a great resolution for you in 2024! I'm using the "YouVersion Bible App +Audio" from Life.Church, if you're wondering.

The biggest goal I achieved this past year was finishing my doctorate and having my final project published online. (It's been downloaded 55 times as of the last week of December.) I wrote about that in a previous newsletter, and I'm thankful that I will be able to officially receive my diploma at the graduation ceremony next May at Concordia seminary in St. Louis. As it turns out, I will get my diploma a week before Ali graduates from Sierra Lutheran High School. Our family is looking forward to making the trip to St. Louis for this momentous occasion.

But before that, on January 17th, I get to have surgery to remove my prostate, along with the cancer that is growing inside of it. Again, I am thankful that it has been caught so early. Tests have indicated that the cancer is completely contained, limited to a couple small spots inside of my prostate and it has not metastasized to the bones or any other parts of my body. Prostate cancer itself is the most survivable form of cancer, with 99% of men who get it dying from something else. My biggest concerns lie with how I will recover afterwards and what kinds of long-term effects will remain after the surgery. It is a huge blessing to know that I have so many people and churches praying for me.

Another thing I'm thankful for is that I have complete confidence in the people who will be leading the ministry here at Bethlehem during the weeks that I am recovering. Our elders, led by Bob Spiker, will be making sure that things continue to run smoothly in my absence, especially regarding worship and care for our members.

Pastor Bill Abbott will be filling in as our pastor not only at worship, but also for visits and any on-call emergency needs. If you have an emergency, please give him a call on his personal cell phone at 310-344-3439. Feel free to lave a message if he is not able to answer immediately,

Also, we will be taking a break from our study of Romans during the Sunday morning Adult Bible Study hour for a few months. Starting on January 7th, Lonnie Karges, our recently retired principal from Bethlehem Lutheran School, will be leading a study called "Rooted" during that time. This study will be looking at the life of the early church in Acts 2 and what we can learn from these early Christians to help us connect with God, the Church, and our purpose.

Finally I want to thank everyone who gave Christmas cards and gifts to my family and me. We feel very loved and affirmed at Bethlehem and are grateful to be a part of this community of faith.

#### MONTH:

- November Offerings of \$25,670 were \$2,020 more than budgeted. Offerings were \$4,148 more than last November. Giving Units were 57, 7 less than October but unchanged from last November.
- Misc. Income exceeded budget largely due to \$750 memorial contribution. Monthly income of \$2,129 exceeded budget by \$3,175.

#### **Bethlehem Women in Mission (BWM)**

Mite Box Sunday: On the first Sunday of each month, mite offerings are collected. In 2023 Bethlehem members have contributed \$844.47 to the District projects. The mites are sent to the California, Nevada, Hawaii LWML District to help fund the mission projects. Bethlehem Lutheran Church sent the mites collected in December were given to help Gospel Outreach in Thailand sponsored by Lutheran Hour

Ministries. The mites collected in January will help fund Indonesian Hymnal Project sponsored LCMS Office of International Mission, Asia Region The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) Office of International Mission and the Indonesian Christian Lutheran Church (GKLI) have been coordinating on the development of an explicitly Lutheran service book in Indonesian since October 2017. To date there is no quality service book available in Indonesian, let alone a quality Lutheran service book. The Indonesian Hymnal Project will open rich musical heritage in liturgy and hymns to all Indonesians; train congregations to think, sing, and speak theologically in Indonesian native tongue while strengthening their Gospel Proclamation in their communities, and be a vial tool for parents/grandparents to pass down the faith to their children and grandchildren. Funds from this grant will help in publishing the Indonesian Hymnal.

#### **ATTITUDE: Old and New**

Let's talk about attitudes. What is an attitude? ATTITUDE is a settled way of thinking or feeling about someone or something, typically one that is reflected in a person's behavior. How you feel about someone or something (usually someone!) affects how you treat them, behave around them, and even what you say to or about them! Let's face it, there is always someone who is hard to like because of their actions, beliefs, and words. We are not required to like everyone, only to love them with God's love. Be very careful about what you say. James 5:9 says, "Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door." Oops, God is there watching and listening. Ugh! Luke 6:37 tells us, "Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven."

I have often had issues with the way others do things and have held it against them in many ways. I finally learned to ask God for a new attitude! Guess what? It works! In Philippians 4:11, when St Paul said, "I have learned, in whatever situation, I am to be content," I know he was not just talking about food and clothing...he was in jail! And then it hit me! I had been asking God for the wrong attitude. Yes, my new prayer is "God, give me YOUR attitude about this person or situation". If I am to have the mind of Christ, I also need His heart. That way I know I have the right attitude! "And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" Galatians 4:6 It's awesome that God sent His son, Jesus, to be light to the world, to give us an example of how to live, and to put His mind of love into our hearts. "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." 1 John 4:11

#### **Elder Page**

#### Circumcision and Name of Jesus

Read Matthew 1:18-25 Psalm 8

When He was circumcised, He was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived.

Luke 2:21

#### Son of David

Parents often spend a lot of time discussing what to name their newborn. Joseph and Mary needed no discussion. The Lord's angel told them that His name was to be Jesus. Jesus is called by several other names. Notably, He is called the Son of David in many verses of the New Testament, in fulfillment of God's promise to David (2 Samuel 7:12-16).

Of the thousands of characters in the Bible, there is only one David. We are told more about him than anyone else in the Old Testament. Paul wrote that "all Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). "All Scripture" included Davidic stories. In this month's devotions, we survey what the Holy Spirit teaches through David's life and faith.

A review of David's story points us to another shepherd and king: Jesus. Gabriel says the Son will be called Jesus, He will be given the throne of His father David, and He will reign forever (Luke 1:32-33). There is power in the name of Jesus. True man and true God. Jesus. At one name, all shall bow and confess Him as Lord (Philippians 2:10-11). That name was given on the eighth day when the shedding of His blood at circumcision foreshadowed His crucifixion and His body and blood, given for you! Eat. Drink. Jesus is Lord!

Lord, teach me to trust, like David, in the name of Jesus. Amen.
