

#### BETHLEHEM CHURCH FINANCIALS: (Narrative/Comments)

#### MONTH:

- December Offerings of \$32,245 were \$7,945 more than budgeted. Offerings were \$11,666 more than last December. Giving Units were 69, 12 more than November and 13 more than last December.
- Misc. Income exceeded budget largely due to investment gain of \$5,368 on the NY Life Bond fund in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2023.
- Monthly income of \$11,643 exceeded budget by \$10,760.

#### Y-T-D:

• YTD Net Income of \$17,766 is now \$10,807 above budget. We are tracking ahead of our budgeted numbers almost completely because of exceptional performance in December.

#### **BETHLEHEM WOMEN IN MISSION**



**Mite Box Sunday**: On the first Sunday of each month, mite offerings are collected. A new member at Bethlehem asked me what are mites. Mites are the small coins that everyone collects in the small boxes in the narthex. The idea of mite collection is based on the Widow's offering found in Luke 21:1-4. The money collected is sent to the California, Nevada, Hawaii LWML District to help fund the mission projects. Bethlehem Lutheran Church sent the mites collected in January

help the Fort Wayne Seminary Food Co-op Concordia Theological Seminar, Fort Wayne, Indiana. The Coop is vital to the livelihood of many seminary students, providing 80-85% of the family's food and household needs at no cost. The seminary seeks to reduce some of the financial burden of the students via the Co-op. This grant is for the purchase of perishable food items and household needs for Seminary students and their families.

The theme is "Gifted to Serve by God's Grace" based 1 Peter 4:10 "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." Gentle and Lowly...Together

We are blessed to have a Pastor that is well educated and can preach the Gospel in a manner that the Spirit reaches listeners of all levels of Bible knowledge. This is an unusual gift and of great benefit to us. As he and his family face his upcoming surgery and recovery, we have an opportunity to come together as a congregation of believers to support them as well as keep the ball rolling at our worship services and outreach to our community via technology. Our online streaming of worship is one of those opportunities. Many thanks to the crew (Clay Soderstrom, Zach Kargas, Kamille Soderstrom, and Josiah Maschke) that prepares graphics and streams our services that benefit viewers at home whether it be due to weather, illness, health, or even curiosity. Their efforts have driven results that are abnormally positive in our current social environment. While most congregations are experiencing a general decline in attendance at worship services our attendance is on the upswing. The number of viewers that accessed our online programing averaged 120 per month a year ago; this past December we hit a high of 200 plus viewers. As the data indicates, our online outreach is a fantastic way to bless our congregation and community. One suggestion that may improve our online program...consider moving toward the front of the sanctuary at least a row or two. The camera is not capable of showing the back half of the sanctuary and although we may have a decent number of folks at the service it appears at times that we do not. In addition, a potential benefit to moving closer to the front can lead to a more meaningful worship experience. Our young families with children are important to see and hear during our worship. Curious young family viewers will be happy to see and hear children and babies and lead to them visiting.

The elders have decided to temporarily change worship service and Bible study times during Pastor Maschke's absence. This is to reduce the load on those leading our worship services and Bible study on Sundays. We have an opportunity to come together and serve our community showing our solidarity and participation in all services (including online streaming) while our pastor is away and recovering. Most folks, including me, are resistant to change at times. Our congregation endured many changes, some incredibly significant, since the outbreak of the pandemic. We endured them together and learned to adjust. As a result, I believe we are stronger for it. We have an opportunity to rally together again while we endure these temporary changes until our pastor returns.

Matthew 11:29, Jesus says, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." Jesus went to (key word "to") sinners both inside and outside of synagogues spreading the Gospel and responded to them in a balanced and sometimes emotional fashion. If I may suggest, one aspect of our modern version of going "to" is our online streaming of worship services. Online worship is a visual manifestation, and indicative of our time, which leads a new generation to our doors. As we experience these temporary worship service changes, perhaps we can learn from Jesus by genuinely exhibiting a gentle and lowly heart...together.


