Liturgical Worship:

Here at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, our Divine Service is liturgical. That means worship that is carefully written down in a form that is purposeful, correct, and timeless. Liturgical forms of worship are designed to proclaim and teach the gospel. The liturgy does this by using a structure that teaches who God is, who we are, and how Christ makes our meeting possible.

There are two main parts to the Divine Service. The first part focuses us on God's Word. After being called to worship by a holy God, the next part of our Lutheran liturgy is a corporate confession of sin and an assurance of God's forgiveness in Christ. Next, having been declared forgiven, we are consecrated as God's people by the hearing and the preaching of His Word. Then we confess our faith by reciting either the Apostles or the Nicene creed.

In the second part of the Divine Service, our attention is directed to God's sacramental presence. Now that we are forgiven of sin, having heard the Word of God, and being united by our confession of faith, we approach the Lords' table. Here, we receive the body and blood of our Savior along with the bread and wine, for the forgiveness of sin and for our spiritual nourishment. Our service concludes as God commissions His people with a blessing to love and serve the word for His sake.
