#### A Patient Spirit

A few months ago, I shared that one of my goals for this year is to listen to the Bible in chronological order. I'm about a third of the way through and this past week, I finished the reign of King David and moved on to Solomon. Now I'm reading from what's called "Wisdom Literature," namely the books of Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon. The book of Job also fits into this category.

I am also a couple of months past having surgery to remove my prostate and the cancer that was found inside of it. I am thankful that I have made significant strides in terms of my recovery and I am not in any sort of pain. But there are still regular reminders that I am not back to where I was before. I am finding that I need more rest than I did before my surgery, and at times I feel my patience wearing thin. I wish I could be completely recovered already.

When I came across Ecclesiastes 7:8, the words kind of jumped out at me. "Better is the end of a thing than its beginning, and the patient in spirit is better than the proud in spirit." Our nation values and celebrates pride, but we don't do much to celebrate patience. However, in the kingdom of God, patience trumps pride every time.

Martin Luther shares some insight into these words in his commentary on Ecclesiastes. First, what he writes is a reminder that in many ways, even across centuries, people are basically the same. "We Germans are especially subject to criticism on account of this vice, that we are lustful for new things," he says. "We begin many things, but we do not continue or persist in anything. This affects us above all in the area of doctrine, where every day we embrace new ones. But this is the fickleness of the human heart." Some things never change.

Luther continues with some profound advice. "In human affairs it is required that one consider the end. What is needed for this is not a proud spirit, which changes immediately because it wants everything to be done at once and does everything with a certain force, but a patient spirit, which overcomes with patience and forbearance the evils that occur and hinder it."

We see this in Jesus' life. In Luke 13, some Pharisees come to Jesus and warn Him that Herod wants to kill Him. Jesus responds by saying "Behold, I cast out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my course." Jesus always seems to have that goal, the end in mind. In fact, Matthew's gospel records Jesus telling His disciples about His suffering, death, and resurrection no less than three different times. He's trying to get them to see the goal, too. Eventually, after He completes all this, they see and remember what He had told them, and they believe. But Jesus always acts with patience, never rushing into any situation or trying to force people to bend to His will, but simply preaching God's Word and patiently letting that message work in the hearts and minds of whomever God wills.

Next month will mark eight years of serving as pastor of Bethlehem Lutheran Church and School, longer than anywhere I've been called in my adult life. There is still much work to be done. Luther sums up some good advice that has been meaningful to me: "See to it, then, that you persevere. You will suffer slander on account of your wisdom; you will experience ingratitude; people will forget your acts of kindness; they will disparage your best advice and will return evil for good. If one's spirit has been unsure, this will cause it to quit. But you, continue bravely and persevere, because God will eventually grant you the fruit of your work."

In late April, I will have a follow-up appointment with my doctor, and I will find out if the surgeon was able to completely remove the cancer or if I have to undergo further treatment, which would likely be radiation. There are some important decisions to be made that are significantly impacted by my health, not least of which is the question of whether we offer one Divine Service or two on Sunday mornings.

It's hard to be patient, especially when the things we have been proud of are taken away. However, God has filled the Scriptures with wisdom to teach us His way. As Luther says,

It is not how you begin that matters, but how you follow through. It is much better to have reached the end than to have attempted the beginning. Do not praise anyone before the Last Day. Not he who has begun, but "he who endures to the end will be saved" (Matt. 10:22).

May God grant us a patient spirit, that we may persevere until our work is done.

An early creed?

Creeds have been important to the Christian church down through the ages. They summarize what Christians believe based on the truths taught in Scripture. In 1 Tim 3:16 is found what appears to be a very early Christian creed:

'And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness; God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.' (1 Tim 3:16, KJV)

Let's unpack the assertions here and see where these truths come from:

'And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness' What is this mystery? It is Christ, and there are six things mentioned about Christ, which make up this mystery.

'God was manifest in the flesh'

John 1:14 tells us that 'the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us (and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father).

'Justified in the Spirit'

1 Peter 3:18 tells us that 'For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive by the Spirit.'

'He was seen of angels'

The angels attended His birth (Luke 2:10-14; His temptation (Matt 4:11) His agony and death (Luke 22:43); His resurrection (Luke 24:4-6); His ascension (Acts 1:10,11).

'He is preached unto the Gentiles'

For so the Lord has commanded us, 'I have appointed you as a light to the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth' (Acts 13:47)

'He was believed on in the world'

And when the Gentiles heard this, they were glad, and glorified the word of the Lord; and as many as were ordained to eternal life believed. (Acts 13:48)

'He was received up into glory'

..when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high..(Heb 1:1-3)

- February offerings of \$27,752 were \$4,352 more than budgeted. Offerings were \$8,542 more than last February. Giving Units were 60, 10 more than January and the same as last February.
- Monthly Income of \$6,456 exceeded budget by \$3,409.

#### BETHLEHEM WOMEN IN MISSION

Mite Box Sunday: On the first Sunday of each month, mite offerings are collected. Mites are the coins that everyone collects in the small mite boxes in the narthex. The idea of mite collection is based on the Widow's offering found in Luke 21:1-4. March is the last month for collecting mites for the 2022-2024 California, Nevada, Hawaii LWML District mission projects. At the district convention in April new mission projects will be selected. The mites collected district wide as of February 29, 2024 totaled more than \$105,000 funding sixteen of the seventeen projects selected at the last convention. When the mites collected in March are received the last project should be funded also. Thank you to everyone who have faithfully supported these mission outreach projects. The new list of Mite Mission projects for 2024-2026 will be available in May.

Bonnie Krenz, the delegate from Bethlehem, will attend the LWML CNH District Convention at the Holiday Inn Convention Hotel in Redding, CA April 19-21. The theme is "Gifted to Serve by God's Grace" based 1 Peter 4:10 "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." She has already voted for the mission projects to be funded for the 2024-2026 biennium. The convention attendees will discover and embrace their spiritual strengths and gifts; build their relationships through fellowship and servant events; and go from the convention to confidently serve God and others with a joyful heart. From April 1st through April 17th, Bethlehem members can help others in need by gathering the following items to be taken to the convention: Baby items such as diapers, wipes, clothes, booties; children and adult socks; and hand or bath towels. There is a box in narthex to place your items.

The Board of Trustees has asked the women of the church to clean and maintain the kitchen area of the church. The Bethlehem Women in Mission Board met and decided that the cleaning would be held one Saturday of each month for those who wish to help—11:00am. The refrigerator was cleaned in March with old items being discarded. The cupboards will be cleaned as time permits with items being sorted and items no longer needed taken to a place where they can be used. We plan to spend about an hour each time we meet. Plan to join the cleaning crew on April 13 at 11:00am.
