MISSION STATEMENT:

To proclaim the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ through witness, mercy, and Christian education The Hay Is in the Barn: Trusting God with Our Stewardship

I have spent many autumns of my life running cross country and later coaching the sport, so the cooler temperatures and changing colors of the leaves always remind me of the final weeks of the competitive season. There's a saying that cross country coaches have used for decades which comes from the book "Running with the Buffaloes," a classic telling of a tumultuous season with the University of Colorado's cross country team in the 1990s. In it, coach Mark Wetmore tells his athletes at the end of their season, "The hay is in the barn." It's a simple but powerful way of saying that all the preparation and hard work are complete—everything that can be done has been done.

In our Christian lives, we also have times where we've done our part and need to trust God for the results. Proverbs 16:3 encourages us: "Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established." We do the work God has given us, trusting that He will bring forth the harvest in His perfect time. Just like the farmer who prepares the fields and stores the hay in the barn, we are called to faithful stewardship—knowing that the fruit of our labor ultimately depends on God.

Galatians 6:9 reminds us: "Let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up." Whether in our giving, serving, or sharing the Gospel, we put in the effort, but it is God who brings about the results. We are stewards, not just of our resources but of the work we do for the kingdom of God.

Stewardship, then, is more than financial giving—it is about how we use all the gifts God has entrusted to us. Psalm 126:5-6 speaks to this beautifully: "Those who sow in tears shall reap with shouts of joy! He who goes out weeping, bearing the seed for sowing, shall come home with shouts of joy, bringing his sheaves with him." We may experience tough times in our lives, times when our giving means we are making sacrifices. We may not always see the immediate results of our efforts, but we trust that God will bring a joyful harvest in His time.

This fall, we are using the Consecrated Stewards program here at Bethlehem to explore what it means to be faithful stewards of everything God has given us. This program is a Spirit-led, free, and joyous response to God's grace through Jesus Christ. It's an opportunity for us to reflect on how we give our time, talents, and treasures to further God's mission in our church and school. Our program culminates with Consecration Sunday on November 10th. During our 9:15 a.m. divine service, we will gather to worship and make our voluntary pledges to the Lord, trusting Him to bless and multiply our efforts. After the service, we'll enjoy a catered luncheon to celebrate the ways God is working among us. We are excited to welcome District Vice President Matt Molinari from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund as our guest leader for this special day.

As we move through this fall season, I encourage you to join me in prayer, asking that God would use the Consecrated Stewards program to deepen our faith and to remind us that, just as the hay is in the barn, God is faithful to bring a harvest from all we do and give in His name.

CONSECRATION SUNDAY IS COMING! Sunday, November 10th, 9:15 am

Mark that date on your calendar as a time of spiritual growth, fellowship, and commitment here at Bethlehem Lutheran Church. November 10th at 9:15am will be "Consecration Sunday," the culmination of a biblically based stewardship education and commitment emphasis called *Consecrated Stewards* that focuses on raising people in Christian discipleship, not just raising money for the work of the church.

To understand the *Consecrated Stewards* approach, you need to know it is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development rather than on the need of the church to receive. It is not based on the budgetary needs of the church but on the desire to have each person grow in discipleship. Opportunity for growth in discipleship will take place during the Sunday before November 10th.

A series of Bible studies on Sunday morning.

Consecration Sunday activities on November 10th including:

Opportunity to make a faith-based commitment during the worship service.

The encouragement to commitment on Consecration Sunday takes place within the context of the morning worship service.

Every attendee and member who completes a commitment card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We also urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card. *Consecrated Stewards* works with people where they are and when they are ready. Members make their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship. Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in our *Consecrated Stewards* events.

Bethlehem Women in Mission Serving the Lord with Gladness MITE BOX SUNDAY: On the first Sunday of each month, mite offerings are collected. The mites are sent to the California, Nevada, Hawaii LWML District to help fund the mission projects.

The November mite offerings will help support Seeing Christ's Light Amid Visual Darkness through the Lutheran Braille Worker. Visual impairment affects 32.2 million adult Americans and reduces their access to written Scripture. In California alone, 797,000 people are blind or have visual impairment. Through this grant, Lutheran Braille Workers' volunteers at the three ministry production centers within the LCMS CNH District will have the opportunity to share the Gospel with people who are visually impaired by producing and distributing free Christian materials in a Specialized Large Print format recipients can see and read. This grant purchases printing supplies.
