“Light a Candle”

The children of the congregation invite all members to the annual Christmas program service on Sunday, December 8th during the morning worship service. Everyone is invited to share a potluck brunch following the service. Please bring a plate of brunch finger food to share and enjoy some Christmas fellowship.

Today is Mite Box Sunday. *The December mite offering will be used to help Spruce Up the Classroom at Grace Lutheran Preschool, Modesto, CA. Grace Lutheran Preschool has been providing Christian education since 1982, and currently educates 75 young children each year. The Advent Wreath

Today, we light our Advent Wreath, which has four candles that symbolize the passage of the four weeks of Advent. One candle is lit each week until Christmas when the Christ candle in the center of the wreath is also lit.

This first blue candle is sometimes referred to as the Messiah or Prophecy candle. This candle represents the Jewish prophets and the prophecies that predicted the coming of the Messiah:

‘Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel’. (Isa 7:14 KJV)

‘But thou, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been of old, from everlasting (Michal 5”2 LJV)
