Worship Together: Guided by God's Hand

In January of last year, Bethlehem Lutheran Church moved to a single Sunday worship service. At the time, this decision was practical, as I was recovering from prostate cancer surgery. However, over the past year, it has become clear that God was using this season to guide us toward a deeper theological understanding of worship and its role in the life of our congregation.

In October, our church leaders and school staff met for a retreat where we created a new mission statement that helps us understand our main priorities as a church and school. "We joyfully proclaim Christ's Word and share His love through worship, education, and outreach."

Worship is at the core of who we are as a congregation. Hebrews 10 reminds us, "Let us not neglect meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encourage one another." Worship is not a spiritual service provided to individual consumers for the sake of conveniently meeting people's individual preferences. If we believed that, it would contradict Scripture and our doctrine. We do not believe that the church is created by people, based on shared interests or mutual affinity.

Instead, we believe that God is the one who creates the church. That is what we confess in the explanation to the third article of the Apostles' Creed in the Small Catechism: *The Holy Spirit... calls, gathers, enlightens and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.* Our Divine Services each Sunday and at other times of worship are the joyful gathering of God's people to receive His gifts, proclaim His Word, pray, praise, and give thanks as we encourage one another in faith.

Consider this: A family reunion wouldn't feel right if members attended in shifts and some never saw each other. Similarly, the church, as God's family, thrives when it gathers together. Over the past year, we have seen how uniting in one service has enriched our congregation. The sanctuary is filled with the voices of God's people singing together, proclaiming Christ's Word in one harmonious voice. We've grown closer as a church family, fostering deeper fellowship and stronger bonds. We have a common education time before the Divine Service, and a common time for fellowship, meals together, and occasional meetings after the service. This unity in worship reflects the unity we have in Christ and strengthens our mission to share His love.

God has blessed us with a powerful reminder that worship is not just something we do; it is who we are as the body of Christ. This journey has also taught us to trust God's guidance, even when change feels challenging. By embracing one service, we're taking a stand against the mindset of convenience and consumerism and embraced worshiping together as one community. It has strengthened our sense of purpose and prepared us for greater opportunities to live out our mission in education, especially through Bethlehem Lutheran School and Sierra Lutheran High School, and outreach to our community.

As we begin our second year of worshiping together in one service, let us celebrate what God is doing among us. Let us joyfully proclaim Christ's Word as we gather each Sunday. Let us share His love in the ways we teach, serve, and reach out to our neighbors. And let us give thanks for the unity we've experienced, trusting God to continue gathering us and leading us as His Church here in Carson City.

Thank you for walking this journey together. I am grateful for each of you and for the blessings God has poured out on Bethlehem this past year.

Bethlehem Women in Mission Serving the Lord with Gladness

MITE BOX SUNDAY: On the first Sunday of the month mite offerings are collected. In 2024 members of Bethlehem gave \$1235.46 for the mite projects. Thank you for all the support you have given this past year. The January mite offerings will help the "Wrap Them in God's Love" project sponsored by Grace Lutheran Church, San Mateo, CA. for \$3,100 Grace Lutheran Church of San Mateo, CA, has had a quilt ministry since 1924, providing quilts to the Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch (RSO) and adult and baby quilts to Seminary and Deaconess students. Costs are high to send the quilts out, and this grant would fund some shipping, as well as augment the funds for fabric, backing sheets,

batting, and thread, so that the quilting group can continue this ministry.

The BWM and Sunday School are working together during 2025 to fill 50 Operation Christmas Child Shoe boxes through Samaritan Purse. To help spread the cost of filling the shoe boxes, each month a needed item will be collected and stored until we hold a "Pack the Christmas Shoe Box" party in November 2025. There is a poster available in the church office listing the type of item being collected each month. Each month the item will be shared during the mite reading. A special collection box will be placed in narthex. For example, in August when school supplies are on sale, the items collected will be school supplies. Below are suggested items by age groups. We suggest you select an age group and either boy or girl and purchase your item each month for that child. This will mean that we will have full shoeboxes. Remember that the items will need to fit inside the Operation Christmas Child Shoebox on the BWM table in the narthex. Prayers that God blesses the success of this project are the most important items. Please pray for the project.

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Gift Suggestion

Girl or Boy age 2-4: "WOW" item, hygiene items, clothing & accessories, crafts & activities, toys Girl or Boy ages 5-9: "WOW" item, hygiene items, school supplies, clothing & accessories, crafts & activities, toys

Girl or Boy ages 10-14: "WOW" item, hygiene items, school supplies clothing & accessories, crafts & activities, toys

Depending on the age of the child you wish to support some months you may need to purchase different items or no items that month. Donations of cash will always be accepted to help cover the handling fee or items that may be needed to complete a box.

Suggestion by type of items: WOW ITEMS: Doll, small purse, hobby kits, deflated soccer ball with pump; large toy. PERSONAL CARE ITEM: toothbrush, washcloth, comb or brush, nail clipper, water bottle, flashlight. SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pencils and sharpener, erasers, pens, crayons, colored pencils, markers, notebooks, construction paper, scissors, ruler. CLOTHING AND ACCESSORIES: flipflops, sunglasses, hat, costume jewelry, hair accessories, clothing and undergarments, winter cap, scarf or mittens. GAMES AND ACTIVITIES: puzzles, coloring books, musical instruments, chalk, jump rope, stickers, games. TOYS: small ball, building blocks, Lego sets, slinky or yo-yo, plastic animals, magnets, finger puppets, other small toys or figures.

Items that cannot be sent are candy, toothpaste, gum; used or damaged items; scary or war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
