Sacred Spaces and Spiritual Symbolism: The Meaning Behind the Furnishings in Our Sanctuary

As we gather for worship each week at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, we are surrounded by a number of sacred furnishings that not only serve practical purposes but also symbolize spiritual truths. This month, I would like to reflect on the meaning and significance of some of the key elements in our sanctuary: the altar, credence table, pulpit, lectern, communion rail, processional crucifix, paschal candle and eternal flame.

The Altar At the center of our worship space stands the altar, the large table-like object in the front and center of the chancel. The word "altar" comes from the Latin *altare*, meaning "a place for offering sacrifices." While no blood sacrifices are offered here, the altar is the location from which we receive the forgiveness for sin Christ earned for us through His sacrificial death once and for all. We receive this forgiveness in God's word and in the Lord's Supper, a foretaste of the heavenly banquet to come. For this reason, we only put objects on the altar that are used for sharing God's Word and sacraments.

The Credence Table This table serves as the place where our offerings are set apart before the service of the Sacrament. By placing these offerings on the credence table, we maintain a clear distinction between our acts of giving and the gift God graciously gives of Himself in Holy Communion. This separation underscores how the offerings we give are not worthy to be compared to the immeasurable gifts God gives us in Word and Sacrament. It would be improper for these to be associated because the Lord's Supper is a free and holy gift, not something we could ever earn or pay for through our giving.

The Pulpit and Lectern These are vital tools for proclaiming God's Word. The pulpit, from which the sermon is preached and the gospel is read, symbolizes the authority of Scripture. Its height and size helps to show the importance we place on proclaiming God's pure Word. The lectern, which comes from the Latin word *lectio*, meaning "reading," is used for reading the Scriptures and leading prayers.

The Communion Rail As we kneel at the communion rail, we are reminded of our humility before God and our need for His grace. This sacred space also calls to mind the fence that Moses was instructed to place around Mount Sinai (Exodus 19:12-13) to signify the holiness of God and the reverence required in approaching Him. Just as the Israelites were reminded of God's unapproachable majesty, the communion rail sets apart the "chancel," the holy space where Christ comes to meet us at the altar, offering His body and blood.

The Processional Crucifix The processional crucifix, carried during special services, reminds us of Christ's most important work: dying for our sake on the cross. When it is carried into or out of the sanctuary, we stand and face this cross that has the figure of Jesus' body attached to it, called a "corpus." We do this to honor our Lord and remember that He comes to be with us in His church in the Divine Service. This visual representation of Christ also reminds us that Jesus goes before us, guiding our steps and inviting us to take up our own crosses and follow Him.

The Paschal Candle This large candle first appears in Advent and is lit from Christmas through the seasons of Epiphany, Lent, and Easter, until it is taken away at Ascension Day. It is sometimes called the Christ Candle, reminding us of Jesus' presence in the world. Now, through our baptism, we have been buried with Christ in His death and raised to new life through His resurrection. We light special candles from the Paschal Candle when we baptize new members of the church, both young and old, as a reminder to let your light shine with the light of Christ.

The Eternal Flame Finally, the eternal flame is a symbol of God's enduring presence. It recalls the pillar of fire that led the Israelites in the wilderness and reminds us of the light of Christ that shines in the darkness, which the darkness cannot overcome. This ever-burning flame assures us that God's promises remain steadfast and true, and He has promised never to leave us nor forsake us (Deuteronomy 31:8, Hebrews 13:5).

Each of these sacred furnishings contributes to the beauty of our sanctuary and helps us focus our hearts on God's grace and promises. The next time you are in our sanctuary, feel free to look closer at these items. As you reflect on their significance, let them help you to grow in your understanding of and devotion to the One who gave His life for us.

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. 1 Corinthians 12:27

Talents in the Church

Paul uses an image in these verses that illustrates the importance of different individuals with different gifts in the church. The image he uses is the body. Different parts of the body cannot exclude other parts—or themselves—because they serve different purposes; that would be ridiculous. For a body to function well, its different parts need to do different things. Otherwise, there is a risk of limiting the capabilities of the body or preventing it from functioning at all.

Everyone has different skills, gifts, and capabilities. Someone might not approach life or ministry from the same perspective as we do, and so we might be tempted to exclude that person. Or we might look at other Christians and be tempted to exclude ourselves because we're not gifted in the same way they are. This passage reminds us that we are all parts of the Body of Christ and that God has gifted each of us in certain ways—but all with grace and intentionality according to His will for us. All the varied gifts of the church come together under the grace of Christ to proclaim His Gospel to the world.



The BWM and Sunday School are working together during 2025 to fill 50 Operation Christmas Child Shoe boxes through Samaritan Purse. To help spread the cost of filling the shoe boxes, each month a needed item will be collected and stored until we hold a "Pack the Christmas Shoe Box" party in November 2025. There is a poster available in the church office listing the type of item being collected each month. Each month the item will be shared during the mite reading. A special collection box will be placed in narthex. For example, in August when school supplies are on sale, the items collected will be school supplies. Below are suggested items by age groups. We suggest you select an age group and either boy or girl and purchase your item each month for that child. This will mean that we will have full shoeboxes. Remember that the items will need to fit inside the Operation Christmas Child Shoebox on the BWM table in the narthex. Prayers that God blesses the success of this project are the most important items. Please pray for the project.

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Gift Suggestion

Girl or Boy age 2-4: "WOW" item, hygiene items, clothing & accessories, crafts & activities, toys Girl or Boy ages 5-9: "WOW" item, hygiene items, school supplies, clothing & accessories, crafts & activities, toys

Girl or Boy ages 10-14: "WOW" item, hygiene items, school supplies clothing & accessories, crafts & activities, toys

Depending on the age of the child you wish to support some months you may need to purchase different items or no items that month. Donations of cash will always be accepted to help cover the handling fee or items that may be needed to complete a box.

Suggestion by type of items: WOW ITEMS: Doll, small purse, hobby kits, deflated soccer ball with pump; large toy. PERSONAL CARE ITEM: toothbrush, washcloth, comb or brush, nail clipper, water bottle, flashlight. SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pencils and sharpener, erasers, pens, crayons, colored pencils, markers, notebooks, construction paper, scissors, ruler. CLOTHING AND ACCESSORIES: flipflops, sunglasses, hat, costume jewelry, hair accessories, clothing and undergarments, winter cap, scarf or mittens. GAMES AND ACTIVITIES: puzzles, coloring books, musical instruments, chalk, jump rope, stickers, games. TOYS: small ball, building blocks, Lego sets, slinky or yo-yo, plastic animals, magnets, finger puppets, other small toys or figures.

Items that cannot be sent are candy, toothpaste, gum; used or damaged items; scary or war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
