Ezekiel 33:7–20

Lenten Reflection 2025

The daily drowning of contrition and repentance, which characterizes the entire Christian life of discipleship, is deliberately intensified during Lent into a renewal of faith and life in Christ. This repentance is not achieved by human wisdom, reason, strength or effort. It is worked in man by God the Holy Spirit through the preaching of the Law and the Gospel. It is the Law that crucifies the old Adam and the Gospel that raises up the new man in us. The preaching of the cross and Passion during Lent is neither an emotional appeal nor a motivational spiel. It is the preaching of repentance unto faith in the forgiveness of sins, and thus to the newness of life that is in Christ. (From ‘Lutheran Service Book Companion to the Services, p.229)
