We joyfully proclaim Christ's Word and share His love through worship, education, and outreach.

"The Kingdom of the Crucified Christ"

As we prepare to enter the season of Lent this coming week, you are invited to journey with us through the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ as recorded in the Gospel of St. Luke. This year's theme is "The Kingdom of the Crucified Christ." We will read and meditate on Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection, revealing the paradoxical nature of His kingdom—a kingdom established not by power or might, but through the weakness and scandal of the cross. Through His suffering and death, Christ offers life and salvation to all who believe.

For centuries, Lent has served as a 40-day season of restraint and repentance in preparation for the joyous celebration of Easter. It is a time to break sinful habits and to practice virtues like generosity, reconciliation, and self-control.

In our worship services, we refrain from alleluias and the Gloria in Excelsis. While these are concrete reminders of the solemn nature of the season, we keep our focus on Christ.

Our Midweek Lenten services will begin at 6:30 p.m. each Wednesday and we will meet for a potluck dinner beforehand at 5:30 p.m. in the fellowship hall beginning on March 12th.

Ash Wednesday—March 5th: "Unless You Repent, You Will All Likewise Perish" (Luke 13:1-9)

We begin our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday with a call to repentance. Jesus' words remind us that without turning to God, we perish. Yet, in His mercy, He grants us time to bear fruit.

March 12th: "A Final Declaration of Love" (Luke 22:31-38)

Jesus prepares His disciples for His impending betrayal and suffering, declaring His love and promising His presence in the midst of their failures.

March 19th: "The Power of Darkness" (Luke 22:39-53)

In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus confronts the power of darkness, submitting to the Father's will and drinking the cup of wrath for our salvation.

March 26th: "Truth Scorned" (Luke 22:54-71)

As Jesus stands trial, He is denied, mocked, and rejected. Yet, He remains a faithful witness to the truth, even as He is scorned.

April 2nd: "Humanity at Its Worst" (Luke 23:1-31)

The crowd chooses Barabbas over Jesus, revealing the depth of human sin. Yet, even in this rejection, Christ's kingdom is revealed as one of mercy and forgiveness.

April 9th: "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" (Luke 23:32-43)

On the cross, Jesus extends His kingdom to a repentant thief, demonstrating that His reign is one of grace and salvation for all who turn to Him in faith.

Maundy Thursday—April 17th: "Our Lord's Last Will and Testament" (Luke 22:7-20)

Jesus institutes the Lord's Supper, establishing the new covenant in His blood and inviting us to His table as heirs of His kingdom.

Good Friday—April 18th: "The Power of the Cross" (Luke 23:44-56)

As Christ breathes His last, the temple curtain is torn, and the centurion declares, "Surely this was a righteous man." The cross becomes the throne from which He reigns.

Finally, we finish our series on Easter Sunday with our Divine Service at 9:15 a.m. with the theme:

"Why Do You Seek the Living Among the Dead?" (Luke 24:1-12)

The empty tomb proclaims the victory of the Crucified King. He is risen, and His kingdom is eternal! Join us each week as we walk this sacred journey together, culminating in the joy of Easter.

Home Plate Standard

Do you know how wide baseball's home plate is? It is seventeen inches. It's 17 inches at all levels. It's the same for T-Ball, Little League, Girls Softball, High School, College, and the Major Leagues.

In 1996, Coach John Scolinos, a former baseball coach who coached at Pepperdine University and Cal Poly Pomona from 1946-1991. He spoke to about 4000 baseball coaches about compromising standards. He held a home plate up and reminded them it was the same 17 inches for little leaguers as it was for the professionsals, the same in Babe Ruth's day as it is today. When a Major League pitcher cannot throw the ball over the plate, he goes back to the minors. What coaches don't say is, "Ah, that's okay Jimmy. If you can't hit the 17 inches, we'll make 18 or 19 inches for you. Maybe 20 inches if that is what it takes." Then he asked the coaches, "What do you do when your star player shows up late for practice, or walks in the locker room unshaven when team rule forbids facial hair? Do you hold him accountable, or do you change the rules to fit him? Do you widen home plate?

He went on to say, "The standard is the word of God, scripture the Truth. Joshua was told, "Be strong and very courageous. Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go." - Joshua 1:7. And Jesus said, "All you need to say is simply "yes" or 'No'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one." - Matthew 5:37. Dads are to honor the Standard personally, in marriage, in the home and beyond."

At the end of his talk Coach Scolinos turned the home place around with the point up. He had drawn windows and a door on it to make it look like a home. He went on to say, "This is the problem in our homes today. With our marriage, with the way we parent our kids, with the way we discipline—we do not teach accountability to our kids, there is no consequence for failing to meet the standard. We just widen the plate." There is a lot of "widening the plate" going on today, longtime standard being compromised.

Enough already! The Standard is the word of God.
