MISSION STATEMENT:

We joyfully proclaim Christ's Word and share His love through worship, education, and outreach.

We the People of Bethlehem Lutheran Church and School

The opening words of the U.S. Constitution, "We the People," talk about bringing people together for a common purpose. Lutherans believe that unity in a local congregation should not be forced by rules or leaders but should come from shared faith, love, and service. Just as the Constitution aims to bring our nation together, the Church should be united by God's Word and Sacraments and the love believers show for one another. This is what we aim for at Bethlehem Lutheran Church and School: "We joyfully proclaim Christ's Word and share His love through worship, education, and outreach." Martin Luther taught that true unity in the Church comes from faith in Jesus, not from church leaders or traditions. He disagreed with the idea that people needed to follow the manmade rules of the Roman Catholic Church and the Pope to be united. Instead, he said that the Church is made up of believers who trust in Jesus for their salvation. The authority of the Church comes from God's Word alone.

Luther believed that unity should be something that churches practice every day. He suggested several ways to build and maintain unity:

- 1. **Preaching and Teaching God's Word** Unity comes from hearing and believing the truth of the gospel. In his *Sermon on the Two Kinds of Righteousness*, Luther said that churches should primarily teach about Jesus' righteousness, not human achievements. At Bethlehem Lutheran Church, preaching Christ's Word is central to our worship and our mission. As Romans 10:17 says, "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ."
- 2. **Baptism and the Lord's Supper** –These sacraments are essential for the Church's unity. In his *Large Catechism*, Luther said that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are gifts from God that strengthen believers' faith. The Lord's Supper, in particular, reminds us that we are part of one body in Christ. 1 Corinthians 12:13 states, "For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit." Likewise, in 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, Paul writes, "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread."
- **3.** Loving and Serving One Another Luther taught that unity is shown through love and service. In his *Treatise on Christian Liberty (The Freedom of a Christian)*, he wrote that Christians are free in Christ, but they should use that freedom to help others. A united congregation cares for one another, forgives, and supports those in need. At Bethlehem Lutheran Church, we follow this principle through our outreach and education programs. As Galatians 5:13 reminds us, "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another."
- **4. Unity of Mind** While Christians do not all do the same work, Luther writes in his *Sermons on First Peter* that "there should be one mind and many works, one heart and many hands. All should not do one and the same work, but everyone should attend to his own duties." It is sinful to think of one person's work as better than another. When Peter writes, "Finally, all of you, have unity of mind," (1 Peter 3:8) this means that before God, everything is equal. All work that is not a sin in itself is good in God's eyes.

5. Correcting Mistakes with Love – Luther knew that people in the Church would sometimes make mistakes. He believed that those in the church should correct errors, not to exclude people, but to help them return to God's truth. In his *Lectures on Galatians*, he explained that churches should discipline members in a loving way, always aiming for restoration. We maintain unity through faithful teaching and pastoral care. As Ephesians 4:15 says, "Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ."

Lutherans believe that a congregation should be united by faith in Jesus, not by human traditions or authority. True unity comes from preaching the gospel, receiving the sacraments, and loving one another. He also knew that keeping unity takes effort and requires patience, forgiveness, humility, and good teaching.




