#### Stand Nicene Creed

We have just finished celebrating Easter, which follows the season of Lent, and next up is Pentecost and the Ascension. These seasons and special days are part of our church calendar. But, why do we have a church calendar? What is the reason for a calendar? This observation perhaps says it best:

'The Church Year comprises the annual ordering and sanctifying of time with the Word of the Lord. It is the calendar by which the Church tracks and rehearses the life and work of Christ in an orderly, methodical pattern shaped by the Holy Gospels and the Creed. It does not attempt to consider and examine everything at once but focuses on the multiple facets of the Gospel one at a time, each in due season, from a variety of angles and perspectives, like a jeweler taking in the beauty of a diamond by gradually turning it in his hand to reflect the light from many sides'.
