MISSION STATEMENT:

We joyfully proclaim Christ's Word and share His love through worship, education, and outreach.

Called to be Proclaimers The Words That Define Our Mission: Part 3

As part of our ongoing series unpacking the mission statement of Bethlehem Lutheran Church, we turn our attention this month to the word "proclaim." Our mission says, "We joyfully proclaim Christ's Word and share His love through worship, education, and outreach." Each word in this statement has been chosen prayerfully and with care, and proclamation stands at the heart of who we are and what we do. But why "proclaim"? Why not simply "teach," "tell," or "share"?

The word "proclaim" carries unique biblical meaning. It doesn't describe any old communication. Proclamation is the bold and joyful announcement of something that changes everything. To **proclaim** is to announce good news with confidence and urgency. Proclamation is the voice of the herald charged by the coming king to announce, "The King is near!"

From the beginning of His ministry, Jesus sends out His disciples with this command: "And proclaim as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand'" (Matthew 10:7). We see this again and again throughout the New Testament:

The man freed from demons in Mark 5 couldn't keep quiet. He went to the Decapolis and "began to proclaim how much Jesus had done for him, and everyone marveled."

Jesus commissions His Church to "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation" (Mark 16:15).

In Acts, Paul boldly "proclaims the way of salvation" (Acts 16:17), even in places where Jesus' name had never been heard (Acts 17:23). Paul and the apostles are constantly proclaiming the saving work of Jesus to skeptics, to seekers, to strangers, and to friends.

And in 1 Corinthians 11:26, Paul reminds us that every time we celebrate the Lord's Supper, we "proclaim the Lord's death until He comes."

To proclaim is to declare good news that demands to be heard. It's public. It's personal. It's urgent. And it's joyful. To proclaim is to make Christ known to a weary world, to hurting neighbors, and to the next generation. Proclamation happens in worship when God's Word is preached. Proclamation happens in education as we pass on our faith to children and adults alike. Proclamation happens in outreach as we share the message with our neighbor, our community and around the world to say, "Christ is risen! There is hope!"

We aren't interested in making our own personal name known or even the name of Bethlehem Lutheran Church and School. Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 4:5, "For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake." We proclaim the kingdom of God. We proclaim the forgiveness of God. We proclaim the goodness of God. We proclaim the promises of God.

This isn't just the job of the pastor or called staff or those in the church who have the gift of evangelism. Martin Luther says that St. Peter "speaks to the whole congregation, to all Christians" in 1 Peter 2:9. There, God commands us all to "proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." So this word "proclaim" reminds us of who we are and what we do. We are not merely a non-profit, social organization. We are the Church: the called and sent people of God, entrusted with the best news the world has ever known. We are not spectators. We are proclaimers.

And we do this *joyfully*. As John writes in his first letter, "we proclaim...so that our joy may be complete" (1 John 1:4). There is deep joy to be found in telling others what Christ has done for us, for them, and for the world.

The word "proclaim" shapes our mission because it flows directly from Christ's command and the Spirit's calling of each of us in our baptism. So as we gather in worship, teach the faith, and reach out to our community, we do so as called proclaimers with this mission always before us.

My Daily Devotion

If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men. 1 Corinthians 15:19.

People often live only for this life. They deny any life beyond the grave. They hope and dream, make plans and carry them out, but only for this life. They may secure an outstanding education, succeed in business, gain great wealth, receive national honors, and help other people. But the hopes fade and the sand falls to the bottom of the hourglass.

Apparently some in Corinth were questioning whether there is such a thing as a resurrection from the dead. Paul points out that our very faith hangs in the balance on this question. With ringing certainty he declares, "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20). "Firstfruits" implies that more is to come. Because Christ, "the firstfruits," died for us and rose physically from the dead on the third day, we who believe in Him will also rise physically from the dead on Judgment Day—and thus complete the harvest, so to speak. We have hope not only here, but also beyond this life.

Hope beyond the grave through Christ's resurrection leads us to live hopefully here. We seek God's purpose for our lives, tell others about His resurrection, and live daily with the quiet assurance that He will take us to heaven. Easter lives on all year long. Eternity beckons with the open, inviting arms of our risen and ascended Lord. Thank God for the hope beyond!

Prayer:

Thank You, Lord Jesus, for Your resurrection which assures me of eternal life with you beyond this earthly life. Amen.

Bethlehem Women in Mission Serving the Lord with Gladness

MITE BOX SUNDAY: On the first Sunday of the month mite offerings are collected. The mites collected in June will go to the project "1 in Every One" New CNH Missions & Ministries sponsored by CNH District Mission Agency, Livermore, CA. In an everchanging and very diverse region of our country, the CNH District has made it a point to reach new people with the lifesaving Good News of Jesus. The CNH District has set a goal to start a new mission or ministry start in each of its 18 circuits ahead of the 2025 district convention. The District Mission Agency provides coaching, resources, and financial help in seeing these missions get off the ground and change lives. M: Mentor: Jesus mentored His disciples during His ministry on earth to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them..." (Matt 28:19-20)

I: Involve/Invite: Use a verbal and *personal* invitation (An invitation in a bulletin or email is not personal)

L: Listen: God gave us two ears and only one mouth for a reason. Listen twice as much as you speak.

E: Encourage: "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up". 1 Thess 5:11

S-M-I-L-E Yes, that's the look for me! I am very blessed, can do nothing less than S-M-I-L-E

Ask Your Father!

The website <u>www.Fatherly.com</u> has a series of articles called, "Twelve Important Questions to Ask Your Dad." Some are about your father's childhood, or his career, or just about life in general.

With that as my springboard, I have come up with my own list of twelve questions. I share them with you to help start a conversation about faith with your dad or with your children! Make the conversation as formal or casual as you want. The goal is to talk about our faith and pass that story on to our children. You can take written notes, but I also suggest that you record the conversation so you also have your father's voice or your voice speaking the answers. If your kids are little, take the list and work through the questions yourself, leaving them either a written journal (that's what I did) or a voice or video recording of you answering the questions.

- 1. Who do you remember first teaching you about Jesus? Was it a family member, Sunday school teacher, or pastor? Is there someone in particular who helped you grow in faith and understand "Jesus Loves Me" is more than just a song?
- 2. When and where were you baptized and confirmed? What do you remember about them?
- 3. What family member, friend, or other individual best modeled God's grace to you when you were young, a teen, and as an adult?
- 4. Tell me about your prayer life. How do you pray? How often? What do you pray for? Do you have a favorite place for prayer?
- 5. Tell about a time when you had to trust the promises of God. What happened? How did that affect your life?
- 6. Tell about a time when it seemed God was silent, or when you felt distant from Him. How did that affect your faith? What did you learn from that experience?
- 7. Tell about a time when God answered your prayers or a time when He did not answer your prayers like you had hoped. What did you hope would happen? What did that teach you?
- 8. What has been the greatest joy as a child of God? What has been the biggest challenge or struggle?
- 9. Has there ever been a moment where you thought or felt that your faith died? When has your faith grown?
- 10. Has there been a moment where you particularly felt God's love, grace, mercy, and compassion?
- 11. Finish this sentence: "I go to church because..."
- 12. Finish this sentence: "My prayer for you is..."

Bonus: What is your favorite Bible story? Why?


