




### **Apostles'** Creed

## **The Tides and the Propers**

In the three year lectionary, the grouping of Sundays and their propers are tied into the five 'tides' of Ordinary Time this way;

Trinitytide	Proper 3 through 7
Apostles'Tide	Proper 8-13
Martyrs' Tide	Proper 14-20
Angels' Tide	Proper 21-25
Pre-Advent Tide	Proper 26 through Proper 29

The ties offer some gentle contours to this long stretch of weeks and months, which felicitously coincide with the basic trajectories of the *ordo salutis*. The tides of Ordinary Time also move with the changing of the natural seasons in the northern hemisphere from late spring through summer into autumn. As such, they coincide with the fundamental agricultural cycles of planting, cultivating, watering and weeding, pruning, and then harvesting just as the Old Testament yearly cycle of festivals closely followed the agricultural season. The Lord and His servants plant and nurture the seed of His Word, which bears the fruits of the cross in the life of His Church, culminating in the final harvest of the resurrection at the Last Day.
