### ***The Time of the Church***

*The non-festival half of the Church Year, that is, the 'Time of the Church', began following the Feast of the Holy Trinity. This long stretch of Sundays is also known in some circles as "Ordinary Time". It is "ordinary", not in the sense of mundane or unimportant, but as that which is normal and normative, as the baseline standard of the church's ongoing life on each. During this time, the church settles into the regular rhythm and stable patterns of practice within which the people of God are able to rest themselves and to grow and mature in the confidence of their confessions.*

*In Around the Year with the Trapp Family (1955) Maria Augusta von Trapp describes the second half of the Church year, following Pentecost and Holy Trinity, as "the Green Meadow" because of the green paraments and vestments that are used in the Sundays throughout the Time of the Church. The image of a green meadow is especially appropriate to the character of this time, which is tranquil, peaceful and gentle, yet living and life giving. Here, the nations find a home in the lush green pastures of the Word of Christ and in the outstretched branches of His tree of life. (Lutheran Service Book, Companion to the Services, pp 255/256).*
